REAR COMMODORE'S REPORT

At this time all of the boats have been removed from the mooring field and winterizing and shrink wrapping are well underway. The mooring floats have been pulled and the chains dropped for the winter. I am pleased to say that for the first time since 2007, we did not have a significant storm in September.

I have been in contact with Canadian Customs about the winter E 99 process. The procedure will replicate the 2009 process. Once all boats are stored, we will compile a copy of the haul out

forms and Canadian Customs will have an agent come to the Club and pick them up. They will then enter the information into their database. Please remember that as boat owners you are ultimately responsible for your E 99 and that you have the option of stopping at the border to obtain the traditional paper E 99. Alternatively you can declare your boat, pay the duty and never have to worry about E 99's again. If you have any E 99 questions or concerns that I have not addressed contact Canadian Customs directly.

This year we relied upon the integrity and honesty of the individuals using the dry sail area to fill out their request form and turn it in to the office. Based upon revenue, not everyone completed this process. If you dry sailed your boat and did not pay please resolve this immediately. You know who you are and we will track you down if you fail to voluntarily come forward. Save yourself the embarrassment and contact Dave or Dayna.

Next season we are going to initiate a sticker system that will identify boats that are properly registered for both dry sail and the mooring field. If you dry sail your boat, it will identify the owner by number and the calendar year. If you are in the mooring field, it will also identify the mooring number so the staff can resolve mooring problems rapidly and efficiently. Periodically the staff will verify compliance. For those of you that have been diligent and honest with your paperwork, I apologize for having to take this step. If you have any questions, comments or suggestions please direct them to my e mail address.

At this time, anyone who wants projects completed on their boats before the spring needs to talk to Dave. We already have a few large projects scheduled so get your name on the list to ensure timely completion. Dave, Gary and Glenn have the skills to complete almost any maintenance or renovation job.

If you have a boat in the dry sail area or on the kayak racks and have not removed it, please do so immediately. As an alternative we are now offering winter storage for Kayaks. If you don't want to be bothered with taking your boat off site, contact Dave or Dayna.

I look forward to seeing all of you at the annual meeting.

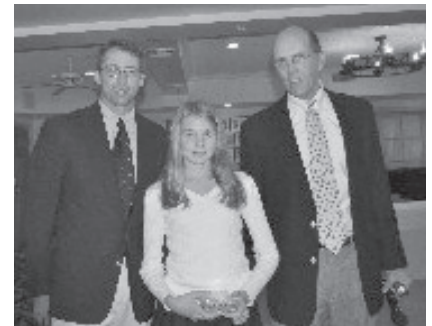

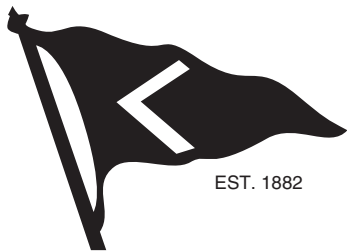

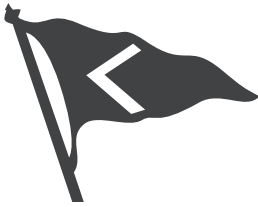


John (Jack) A. Turner – 3287 L

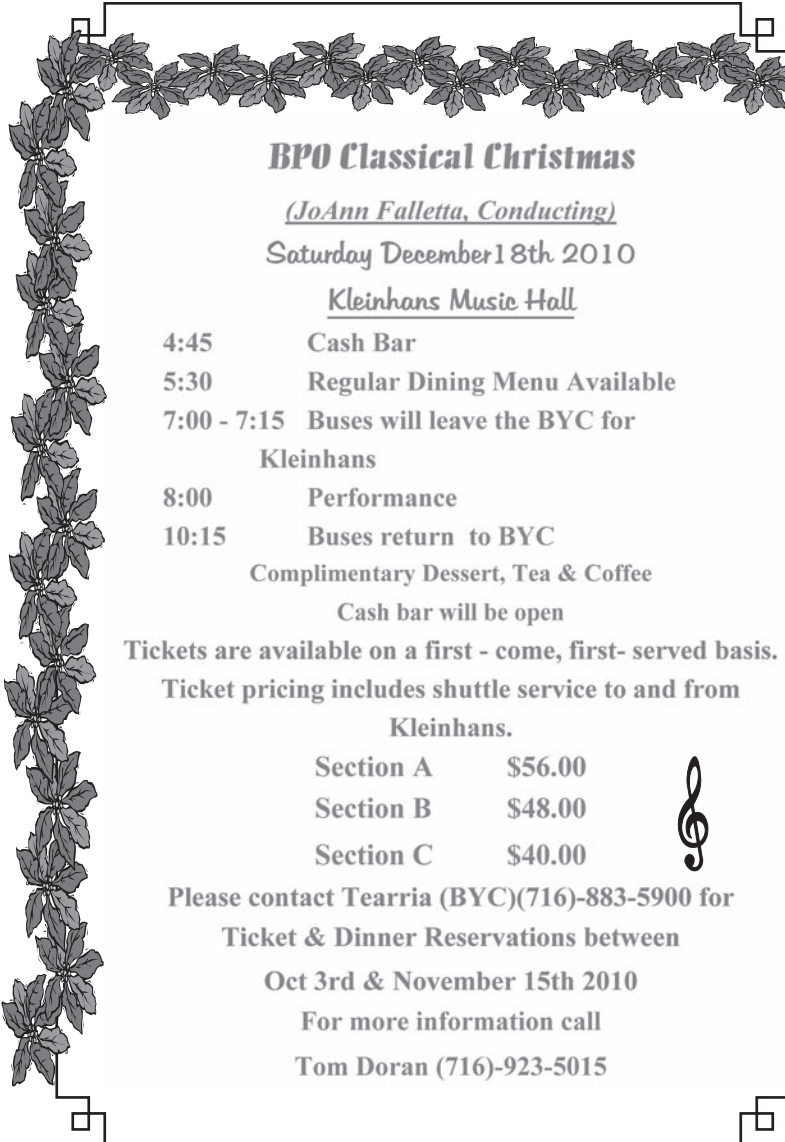

Proposition 1: To amend Chapter III of the By-Laws of the Club to reflect that the past and current practice of placing responsibility for the Outer Boathouse with the Building and Grounds Committee (Sec. 5) rather than the Boat Committee as well as the past and present practice of storing non-member boats (Sec. 13).

The affected sections are modified as reflected below by strikethrough of the words and letters to be deleted; additions are in boldface:

Sec. 5. The Buildings and Grounds Committee shall consist of five members of the Club selected from the Life and Active membership, the Chairman of which shall be a member of the Board. This Committee shall have charge of the groundsmen and the maintenance and repair of, and the additions to, real estate and buildings of the Club except the inner ~~and outer~~ boathouses.

Sec. 13. The Boat Committee shall consist of the Rear Commodore, who shall be chairman, and five members of the Club. This Committee shall have charge of the boatmen and management of docks, moorings, boat storage houses, ~~lower floor of the boathouse,~~ floating property, all equipment for launching, hoisting and storing boats owned by members **and non-members**, and shall be responsible for the operation and maintenance of docks and inner ~~and outer~~ boathouses.
